#### **Testing / Dates for YET 2011**

The team is working on test cases. As soon as we have results we will know if we can change the starting date for YET, but at this point it is still July 22<sup>nd</sup>.

#### **Health Checks**

The Health Checks are being done every Monday and sent out to districts. If you have any questions on anything you receive in your Health Check, please contact the Service Desk, they will be happy to help you out.

#### **YET Contacts**

If you have not already identified or updated your YET contact on the ISW please do so as soon as possible. We need to be able to reach someone in each district during the running of YET, in case we encounter any data problems. This needs to be someone who will be available by phone, who can either change data or give approval for us to change it.

#### **SD Test**

One of the first steps in Year End Transition is to refresh SD Test. We have received a few requests to take data entered in SD Test during YET and add it to Production, for example if you are entering Summer School marks in Test you can request that we move them to Production for you after YET. This is a Catalogue Service that is available to districts. If you are interested, please submit a HEAT ticket to request this service.

#### **CC and YET**

Courses that are closing this year (e.g. Math 11) will not go through the CC and YET process. Daniel Bond will follow up with the Ministry regarding the guidelines around the time in which a student can finish any of the closed courses.
