

<p>Check your YET Contact information</p>	<p>Districts are requested to check their YET contact information on the ISW at: ISW-BC Home > District Collaboration Centre > Search > Contact search.</p> <p>In the “Role” drop down menu, choose YET Contact. In the “Organization” drop down menu, select your district.</p> <p><i>If names, telephone numbers, or any other information has changed from last year, please contact the Service Desk with an update.</i></p>
<p>Health Checks</p>	<p>Health checks are scheduled to begin this week. We will do a preliminary run and report status of data health next week. If problems are identified, the YET contact or L1 will be advised of anything that needs to be corrected.</p> <p>Districts asked for a checklist of the types of things we check for with these reports. This is in development and will be posted as soon as possible. In the meantime, we’re watching and if there is anything in your data that could cause the YET process to stop, we will contact you.</p>
<p>Timelines</p>	<p>Timelines are posted on the public YET 2010 release information page on the ISW – which can be accessed easily using the link on the BCeSIS Important Dates calendar. <p>Pre-Transition Verification Report</p>	<p>SD75 asked about an exception on the Pre transition verification related to courses with no final reporting periods, the reason that the school has a section for the course but it is not being. Will this need to be cleaned up for YET to run?</p> <p>Robin Lau responded that we will check on this. It is part of the checklist but it is not certain whether this actually causes problems. We’re advising districts about it but more for their information, so they are aware that empty sections exist.</p>
<p>Lockers</p>	<p>SD36 asked about lockers and YET – i.e. what information is carried forward, if any, and what is not. Several districts reported their experiences.</p> <p>Robin Lau responded that this is one of the things we will be testing again this year. School locker numbers are not affected by YET but lock combinations and locker assignments are - depending on the next year locker validation choices a school makes.</p> <p>Note: this information will be covered in the new YET Advanced learning event.</p>
<p>Program Codes</p>	<p>SD33 asked about open (i.e. not end dated) and end dated program codes and what will happen with these.</p> <p>Discussion ensued with many districts speaking to what their practice is. Some never end date programs, other end date programs every year.</p> <p>There are a couple of problems that occur if programs are not end dated. For example, if a student with a non-end dated program goes to a new school, 1701 will not pick up that program assignment but some other reports will. Also, the GDE only picks up current year program assignment data, not programs left open from other years.</p> <p>Note: this information will be covered in the new YET Advanced learning event.</p>

Withdrawn students with the next school field still populated	<p>SD69 brought up a concern about students who are pre-transitioned in one school and then, before school ends, they are withdrawn without being removed from the pre-transition list.</p> <p>If that student is picked up by another school, they will show up with the original school's pre-transition list setting – i.e. the next school will be whatever was entered on the original school's list.</p> <p>SD23 advised that they had submitted a HEAT ticket related to this, with concerns about how this could affect next year enrollment numbers – i.e. even if the student is withdrawn, will they show up in next year numbers because of the next school setting on the pre-transition list?</p> <p>Response: We will check into this and report back.</p> <p>SD68 commented that a school admitting a student who was withdrawn, but who still exists on a pre-transition list, will receive a warning message. They wondered if it would be possible for a similar message to be displayed for a school withdrawing a student – i.e. a warning that the student still existed on their pre-transition list. They said they would submit a CR to have this considered.</p>
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
