

There was not much to report or discuss on this week's call. The few updates were as follows:

<p>YET code and testing</p>	<p>The full test that was kicked off late Friday continues. As usual, we are monitoring every hour 24/7 to make sure it keeps running. So far so good and, as of noon yesterday, it was in the middle of the test.</p> <p>As mentioned, there are 30% more students than last year. We are currently about 8 hours behind our estimate but we still anticipate that we will be able to finish within the estimated week timeframe.</p> <p>We posted a summary last week of the test results from the first mini-test run. One item reported to aal from this test: a Grade 12 student was not withdrawn and they are looking at that right now. We will post updates as received.</p>
<p>District Data Verifications (Health Checks)</p>	<p>Looking quite good as per the stats from this morning. One concern: There is one student whose next school is an alternate school sub-type. Reminder to everyone that this will not work. An e-mail has been sent to the affected district.</p> <p>If you are having problems with any of the health checks we've identified, or if you have any questions, please contact the Service Desk.</p>
<p>CC and YET</p>	<p>We have our list of 22 participating districts and it's ready to go.</p>
<p>Summer Schools</p>	<p>There was a little confusion when one district submitted a ticket yesterday saying that they had missed the deadline for Alternate YET. Reminder that there is no need to identify participation in Alternate YET. It will be run automatically for all Summer Schools. This is completely separate from CC and YET, a process which is only run on the schools that have been identified.</p> <p>Reminder that, again this year, the grades for specific courses being taken will need to be entered manually on the 1701 spreadsheet, as this is a Ministry requirement for these schools.</p>
<p>Pre-transition Validation report</p>	<p>The Pre-Transition Validation report is under 19 Year End Reporting on the Reports tree. It can only be run by a user with All Forms and Reports security access (typically L1s or YET contacts only) and it can be produced for individual or multiple schools.</p> <p>The report validates, for example, if a student is pre-transitioned to an alternate school sub-type, which as mentioned above, will not work through YET. It can also be used to validate graduating students against diploma granted date (Diploma Met field) or to confirm whether teachers/users (Next Year's staff assignment) have valid assignments for next year.</p> <p>The Pre-Transition Validation report document, available on the Learning Resource Centre > Recurring Events & Processes > School Year End (pre-YET Activities) page, explains the screen, the report itself and what the results should be. We will also post a link to this resource on the Important YET Resources table on the YET 2010 page.
